## Choosing a name where do we start?

You have taken a truly big step. This new member of the family may be a playful pup or a more mature dog relying on you to give it the chance of a loving home.

To many their dogs are their children to others a companion to sit on the porch with and watch the sun go down. Learn to love and share your time with your dog and it will reward you with loyalty and companionship that is seldom found in our two legged friends.

This book was written to help you choose a name for your new companion; don't underestimate the importance of the task at hand. You will be using his or her name dozens of times each day, many thousands of times each year. The repetition of the name so many times will have its effect you also. Remember, the name you choose will form one of the foundation stones upon which you will build your relationship.

## How About Here?

Many of the ancient sciences are now experiencing a comeback. Most of us are aware that many cathedrals and other places of worship (to say nothing of government buildings) were built following rules of geometry and numerology that had been passed down from one craftsman to another going back for centuries, many buildings have been shown to have deliberate and undocumented deviations from the original drawings.

Modern bank and telecommunication companies now get their plans checked by numerologists and feng shui experts. Why? Because it is a competitive world and it has been proven to increase their chances of success. So, we have an important decision to make, let's use all the information, a bit of intuition and let's enjoy the process.

## You must pick a name you are happy with.

Before we explore the wonderful world of numerology and learn how it can help us choose a perfect name, let us look at couple of practical considerations you should bear in mind.

The name you choose must be right for both of you, it should be comfortable to use, easy to call out and one that you are happy calling out. You might be more comfortable calling "Lassie" in the park rather than "Minnesota Fats".

It must also be practical and easy to recognize, not easily confused with other words you use often, or commands that will be used to tell him what you expect him to do.

Avoid names that sound like the standard commands of no, stay, sit, come, down or fetch. For example “Joe” is probably too close to “No”.

Don't make the bonding process unnecessarily confusing for your new companion.

Don't forget that dogs definitely respond better to one or two syllable names.

### [The wonderful world of numerology](#)

Numerology is an ancient science used to study life and the creation, the whole of life's potential is contained in the numbers between 1 and 9.

Once we understand this and learn how to interpret them the numbers themselves become a powerful a tool to help us plan our lives, maximize our potential and take full advantage of opportunities that present themselves. Oh, and give our little friend the best start in life.

### [How does it work?](#)

There is no such thing as random and nothing happens by chance, if we don't understand why something has happened it's because we don't understand. It is a little foolish to think that the laws that support and sustain the creation have broken down because something that happened in your life is not to your liking and seems to have happened without good cause (we rarely question fortunate occurrences).

The universe is like an intricate machine with everything in it effecting and being effected by everything else. These complex relationships that bind and control each piece can be understood better through the study of numerology.

### [What part do numbers play?](#)

The entire universe is made up of vibrations (particles of moving energy), even things we don't consider “solid” such as sound, color, fragrance, thought, etc, are all vibration. Numbers are an expression of those vibrations; just as they are an expression of the “laws” of science and geometry that we use to built homes and hospitals with, and dog kennels.

Once we find out the vibration rate of an object, we can then establish the qualities and energies associated with that object.

## [Where did numerology come from?](#)

The history of numerology takes us back to the dawn of consciousness of mankind; there never was a time when numerology did not play its part. However, the father of modern numerology was the Greek Pythagoras he was born around 600 BC in Samos. Pythagoras sought to free the mind of humanity from political and religious confinement. He gathered around him an ever-increasing number of students keen to understand themselves and their place in the universe, and to discover the meaning of love and life.

He established the “school of mysteries” in Crotona southern Italy. Admission to his school was open to all who sincerely sought to learn, and no distinction was allowed to prevail against sex, race, color or creed; his school became the world's first co-educational institution. His school introduced the concept of graduated learning, the very foundation of our modern education system. Pythagoras taught his students the sciences of numerology, astrology, geometry, and mathematics. He also instilled in them the importance of meditation, music, nutrition, fitness, personal hygiene and architecture. He called his system of teaching “philosophy”, which he defined as “the love of truth and wisdom”.

Much of the Teachings of Pythagoras have been lost, but thanks to the efforts of some of his pupils (Plato, Porphyry and Proclus) we still have some examples of his brilliance. Porphyry wrote, “Numerals were hieroglyphical symbols by which Pythagoras explained all ideas concerning the nature of things.” Philosophy can be thought of as a gymnasium of the mind, just as we can exercise and strengthen our body, philosophy develops and opens the mind. Through philosophy and its ally meditation we gain insight and intuition. It is through this intuition that the secrets of numbers and their relationship to all things living and non-living can be uncovered.

*You have the ability* develop the intuition to work it all out for yourself and one day I hope to help you develop it, but it takes time, certainly too long for your pup to wait. So for now, let’s apply proven principles to the task at hand.

## How important is a name?

Numerology tells us that the name of any given thing contains the essence of its being. All of us, and everything in our world, are influenced by everything else in the creation; those influences can be identified and predicted through the use of numerology. A name or a set of numbers can be analyzed and hidden information about that person, animal or thing will be revealed. Your name represents an environment caused by your higher self for growth and development. By using the science of numbers the effects of that environment can be maximized by avoiding or removing negative aspects with a resulting improvement in the quality of life.

Using the three keys to choose an advantageous name. Before we choose a name let's examine how the effects of that name will be calculated. We have already discovered, every letter, every word and every name vibrate to a number, and every number has a hidden meaning. Using the following chart we can convert the letters in any name to its numeric expression. Then, using simple calculations, we can determine the number that represents the hidden meaning behind the name.

## The first Key the overall expression

or

### How the pup might behave most of the time

For example, using the name ERIC, we can determine that the “E” converts to the number 5; the “R” converts to the number 9; the “I” converts to the number 9, and “C” converts to the number 3. By adding the four numbers together we get 26 ( $5 + 9 + 9 + 3 = 26$ ), then we add these to digits together to arrive at a single number ( $2 + 6 = 8$ ), we have the personal number that corresponds to the name Eric. The number is 8. This is the first part of the puzzle, the first key if you like. This is an indication of the **overall expression**; it gives an indication of Eric’s sense of purpose and where fulfillment might lie.

Note: Occasionally when we add the numbers of the letters together we may get the numbers “11” or “22”, these are referred to as master numbers and are considered significant since the trait they describe will tend to be more pronounced. This is true whichever category we are looking at. We will look at these later.

## The second Key the soul urge number

or

### How the pup might surprise you sometimes

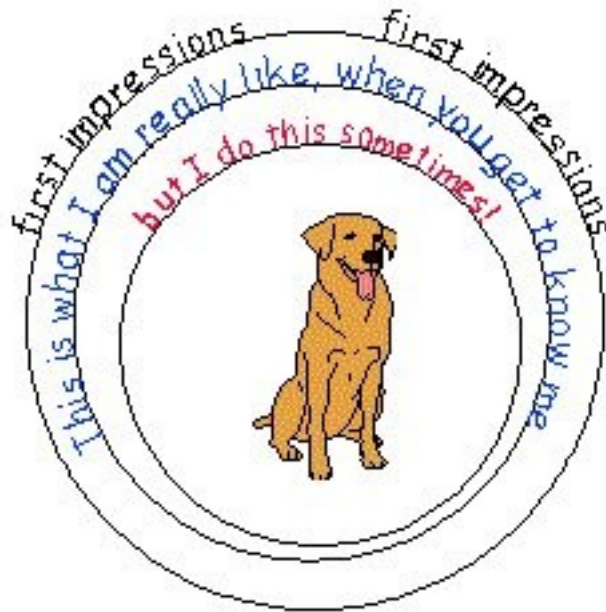
The second key is found by adding together the numeric expression of the vowels in the name, in this example the “E” converts to the number 5 and the “I” converts to the number 9. Again add these together ( $5 + 9 = 14$ ) we then reduce these to a single digit ( $1 + 4 = 5$ ). It is said that the vowels are the soul of a word and their cumulative expression is know as the **soul urge number**. This is an indication of underlying feelings or emotions and offers an explanation why Eric may occasionally behave in a certain way in spite of training and logic.

## The third Key the personality number

or

### Likely first impressions

The third key is found by adding together the numeric expression of the consonants in the name, in this example the “R” converts to the number 9 and the “C” converts to the number 3. Again add these together ( $9 + 3 = 12$ ) we then reduce these to a single digit ( $1 + 2 = 3$ ). This number is often referred to as the **personality number**. This number gives an indication how Eric might appear to the rest of us when we first meet.



## What the numbers mean.

### The first Key the overall expression

or

How the pup might behave most of the time

Without a doubt the overall expression is the most important category, first impressions are exactly that and the occasional expression of a deep seated character trait should be considered refreshing rather than worrying.

1

When the overall expression is “1” your friend will tend to be pushy, love the spotlight and enjoy being the center of attention. On the down side, you may need to be extra patient around training issues. Since one's tend to be bossy, they will run your household if you let them. Gently, patiently, and humanely let them know who is really the boss.

2

If the number is “2” Chances are your pet will love being outdoors, since they thrive on beauty, nature, and harmony.

Given their “2” natures, these animals probably spend a little more time than others in grooming themselves. If you are lucky, they may even enjoy being bathed, without all the usual fuss.

Because these animals are very sensitive try to avoid loud arguments, blaring music, and unnecessary clutter. “2” animals hate anything that smacks of chaos or disharmony.

3

“3” pets are party animals. They generally love to eat and enjoy meeting new people and going new places. Also, these people-loving animals may have a tough time with separation anxiety.

If you absolutely must leave them alone for long periods, make sure they have plenty of toys and leave music or a television playing in the background. Then when you walk in the door, be ready for one happy and joyous reunion!

#### 4

“4” pets thrive on routine. So no matter how hectic your life becomes, stick with a regular schedule of meal times, walks, and play periods. These pets have a strong internal clock and will get cranky if you make it wait too long for a meal

Whenever possible, introduce any necessary changes to the pet's schedule or environment in a slow, gradual way.

#### 5

“5” pets are natural wanderers and will love to share a walk with you. The only problem is that sometimes they wander too much. Unless you have a nice fenced-in yard, never turn this pet loose without supervision, 5's crave variety and tend to get lost in the moment which may well stretch in to hours.

When they eventually do turn up don't be surprised if they are the proud bearers of an unpleasant aroma, because of their sensual nature 5's love to roll in stuff.

#### 6

“6” Animals make great service animals or working dogs and are at their happiest when they are contributing as part of a team. You may find them “looking after” the family in the same way as they would look after their own pups. They will watch over you when you are sick and may intervene if members of the family start arguing with each other. Like the good mother it may neglect it's own needs to look after others make sure you don't forget to give it praise and attention because it probably won't ask for it.

#### 7

If the number is “7” you may have a loner, these tend to be the quit ones. It's not that they don't love you or love being around you, it's just that they need to hang out by themselves for a while. They really do need your company more than they let on!

#### 8

The number “8” dogs are the “drama queens” of the dog types. When they are bored or frustrated, they will sometimes pull mischievous stunts just for the

excitement.

They are never too shy to get themselves noticed especially if there is food involved.

## 9

If the number is nine your pet will probably, at sometime, will display all the qualities of the other pets listed above (One through Eight). Even as youngsters, they have a mature quality. And ironically, in later life, they often seem more youthful than their years. They also tend to be especially sensitive to your psychic vibes. And so what if they are sometimes mysterious? In a pinch, these animals will do everything they can to protect you.

## 11

The Eleven is a Master Number that “breaks down” into a two. So basically all that applies to “2”s above, also applies to your pet as well. It's just that occasionally these eleven animals will respond to the world at a higher vibration. Eleven pets don't just thrive in atmospheres of beauty and harmony, they try to create it in whatever ways they can. So don't get too upset if your dear pet sometimes makes a mess of the living room. For all you know, they might be trying to make an artistic statement. Or a suggestion that you finally rearrange the furniture! Naturally psychic animals, they are at their best when they are spreading joy around your household--and the neighborhood.

## 22

Twenty-two is a higher vibration for the number four. So everything said about a four pet applies to your pet as well. In addition to being in touch with your innermost thoughts, twenty-two's notice changes on a global scale. For example: Some pets may react strangely just before there is a calamity in the family or an earthquake about to strike. Keep an eye on that twenty-two and you might be warned of impending danger. For the most part, however, your twenty-two pup will be loyal and reliable. And appreciates your showing the same qualities.

## [Explanation of the table](#)

The following names have an explanation of the root or origin of the name. The numerological calculation has been done for you, the center column “T” refers to the total value of all the letters in the name and give an indication of the overall expression or how your pup/dog can be expected to behave most of the time.

The column marked “V” is the numerological expression of the vowels only and gives an indication of the deep-seated tendency or how your pup/dog may surprise you from time to time.

The column marked “C” is the numerological expression of the consonants only and gives an indication of the way your pup/dog may appear to you and others the first time you meet.

You will notice some numbers marked with an asterisk “ \* ” these numbers have been derived from the master numbers 11 and 22 which break down into 2 and 4 respectively. The master numbers are an indication that the behaviors indicated might be more pronounced than otherwise might have been expected.
